



Post-Secondary Award Program

The post-secondary award program was developed to provide support to members living with inherited bleeding disorders who are pursuing post-secondary studies. A maximum of two awards of \$1,000 may be awarded annually. Successful applicants will receive their award through the educational institution which they attend.

Eligibility Criteria

- 1) Be a registered member of CHS-MC living with an inherited bleeding disorder (Hemophilia, von Willebrand Disease, rare inherited bleeding disorder or identified as a symptomatic carrier of an inherited bleeding disorder).
- 2) Possess academic achievement of a minimum of 75% (grade 12), or current post-secondary GPA of 3.0 on a 4.5 scale and meet the academic standards to allow admission or continued study at a recognized post-secondary educational institution. A final transcript of grades must accompany the application.
- 3) A letter or printed email from the post-secondary institution indicating acceptance or eligibility for enrollment in the upcoming academic year.
- 4) Funding will be limited to one year.

Evaluation of this award is based on:

- 50% - Grades
- 20% - Essay
- 20% - References
- 10% - Community and volunteer involvement
